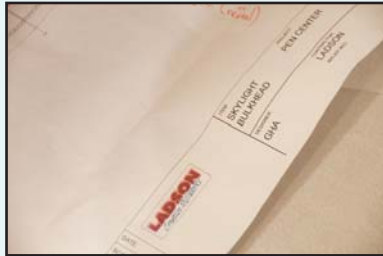
- The installation of the new drywall ceilings is proceeding throughout the shopping centre including the completion of the drywall in the bulkheads of the five skylights.

### Giant Crane Adds New Rooftop HVAC Units

If you were around the Pen Centre on January 9th, you would have seen a giant crane lifting numerous new HVAC units onto the roof of the centre. Amherst Cranes with their fleet of machines and expert operating engineers managed the project. They operate a fleet of mobile, hydraulic cranes ranging in size from 8-ton capacity to 300-ton capacity. The addition of the new HVAC units are all part of the \$13 million make-over of the centre.
